**FOLLOWING DOTTED LINES IS SOMETIMES “TO MUCH DETAIL” OR “CONFUSING” FOR A SMALL CHILD. NOT TO MENTION “DOTTED LINES” ARE A BIT SKINNY FOR A CHILD’S FINE-MOTOR ABILITY TO ACTUALLY BE ABLE TO STAY ON THEM WHEN WRITING!**

**USE A YELLOW HIGHLIGHTER!!!**

**WRITE THE LETTERS OR WORDS OUT FOR THEM! IT IS EASIER FOR CHILDREN TO TRACE BECAUSE IT LOOKS LIKE A CONSTANT, CONTINUOUS LINE WITHOUT SO MUCH “STUFF” GOING ON. PLUS THE OUTLINES ARE LARGER FOR THEIR FINE-MOTOR ABILITIES!**
