

Who's Bigger and Smaller than me?

Cut each of these animal pictures out individually. Lay them down on a flat surface or hold them up one at a time to teach your child. Ask your child, while pointing to the picture, “is this animal bigger or smaller than you are?” Help guide their answers to correct thinking by providing reason of WHY that animal is either bigger or smaller than them. Build comprehension in your child by providing detailed answers OR ask your child questions of why they think what they think.

Such as teaching your child: “The elephant is very big. It is tall, large, heavy, and has big giant feet. It is bigger than you by a lot.” OR “The bug is smaller than you because he crawls on the ground, has a little body, and is about as long as one of your fingers.”
