

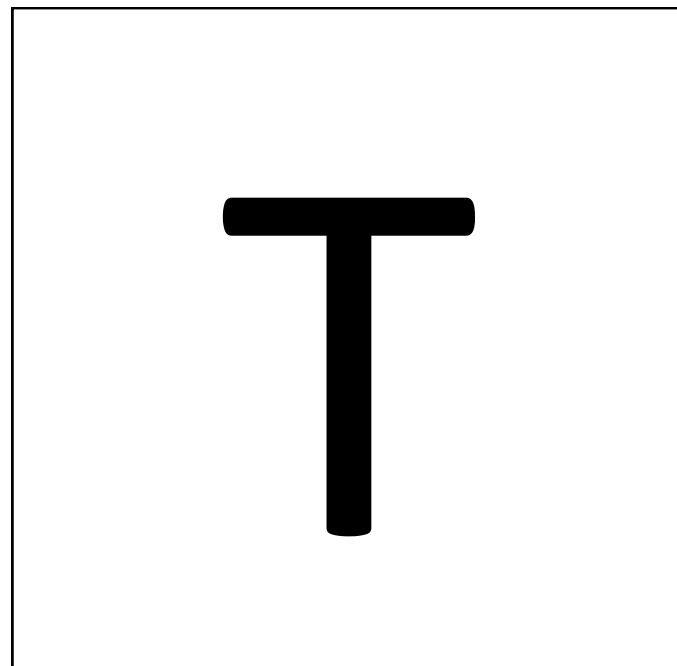
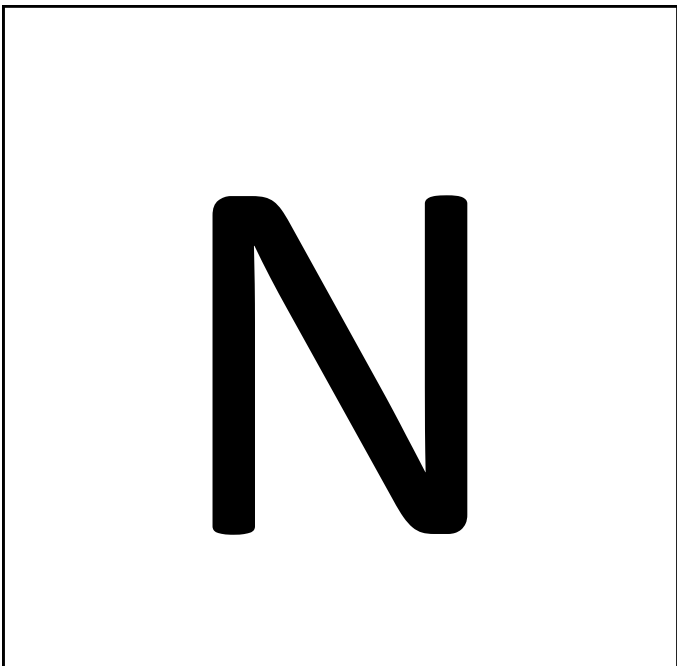
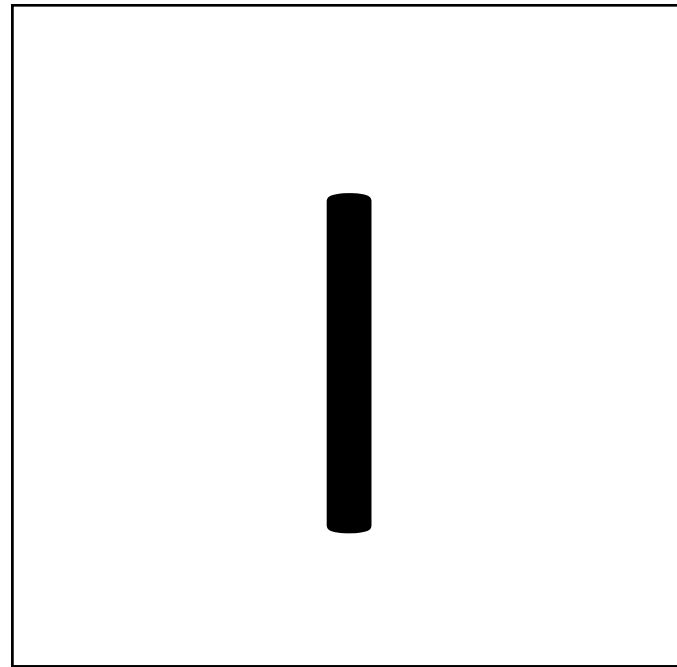
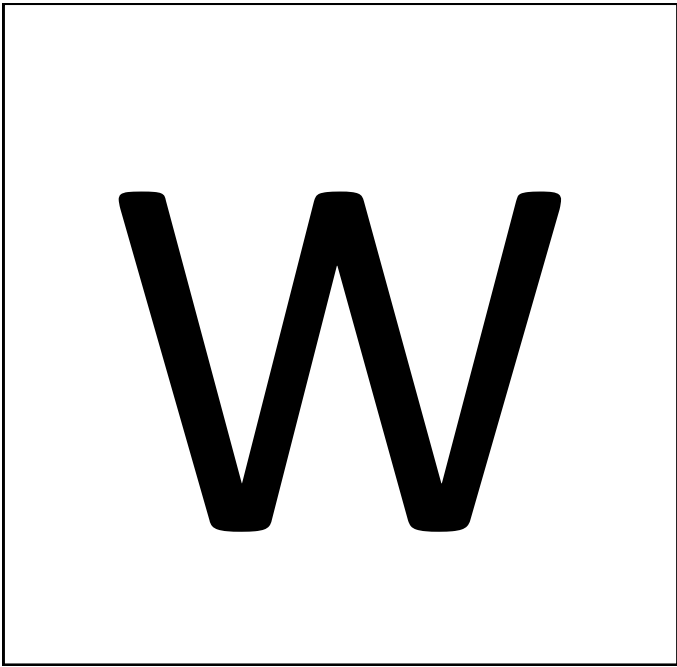
## **BUILDING WINTER WORDS**

Cut each of the letters in the words out individually. Help build early reading and language skills through building new words. Have child put the letters back together in order to form the words. Help as necessary.

Use the whole words provided to guide your child to understand which letters come first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth & so forth...until the words are all built.

Go back and say the letters in each word (have child say them with you), pointing to them each as you do so, spelling each word out with your child and then asking them at the end of spelling out each word to tell you what that word is.

You may have child glue the letters in order on a blank sheet of paper for easier understanding and capability to complete lesson.
