ABC Egg Find Ages 1 year to 2 years

Objective: The child is introduced to the letters of the alphabet through sensory play.

Materials needed:

Plastic Easter eggs (at least 26) Easter grass Black Sharpie Marker (you will use only)

Procedures:

- Before beginning lesson, write all of the letters of the alphabet (uppercase only is fine) on each of the Easter eggs; same letter on both ends per egg.
- 2. Put all of the eggs in a large basket or container. Add in small amounts of the grass.
- Have your child sit next to the bucket or container and let them explore using their sense of touch.
- 4. Show them you can open and close the eggs and match ends with same letters on them.

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- 5. Go through the eggs and find all of the ones with each letter in your child's name.
- 6. One at a time, show it to your child, spelling out their name.
- 7. Now find the letters for easy words, like "mom or dad". Show the letter to your child and say it to spell each word out.

Milestones to meet:

The child is introduced to letters. The child uses fine-motor skills to open, close, and match eggs. The child begins building early language awareness and concept of print association.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
