

Objective: The child begins to recognize the alphabet while using play dough to explore and create letters.

Materials needed:

Play dough Small Popsicle sticks

Plastic Knife

Picture examples on next page

Procedures:

- 1. Have your child sit on an easily cleanable surface for this activity.
- 2. Give them one color of play dough. With your child, start flattening it out, rolling into balls, tear into pieces, and squishing it in your hands.
- 3. Now using the popsicle sticks, flatten out the play dough into a pancake. Press the letter "A" using the sticks into the dough. Say the letter and have your child repeat it. Do other letters (T, U, L, N, M, X, & Y are easy). Child can help.

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- 4. Let them explore and create with the popsicle sticks and play dough freely. Remind them to keep trying to create letters.
- 5. If you have the ABC Cookie Cutters, doing with them, make play dough letters. Have your child say the letter as they cut it out.

Milestones to meet:

The child begins to recognize letters. The child can use fine-motor skills to explore and manipulate play dough; they can create letters using sticks in the dough. The child can recognize and say some letter names.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
