



ABC's on the TV

Ages 2 years—3 years

Objective: The child is introduced to letters and matches them on the TV.

Materials needed:

White paper (cut whole sheets in half; you will also need small squared pieces of paper)

Marker

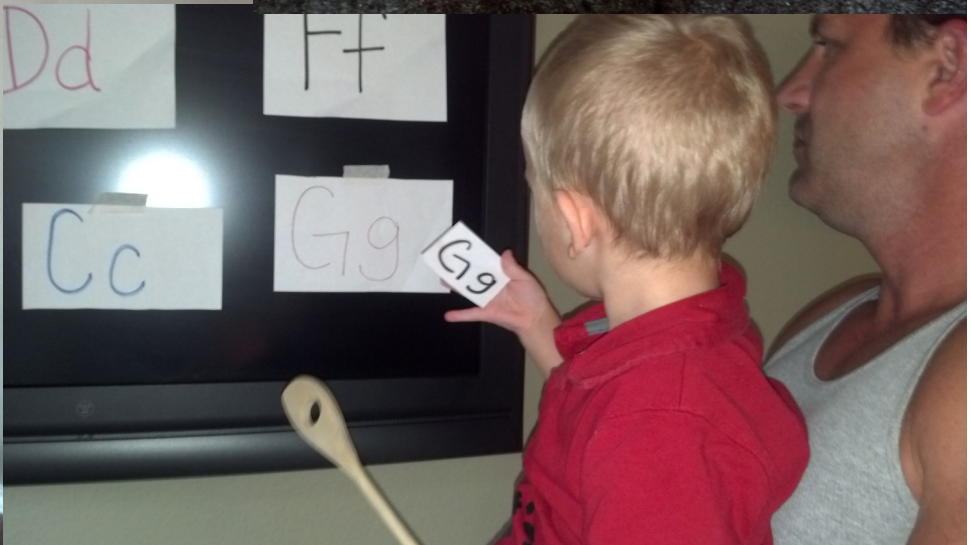
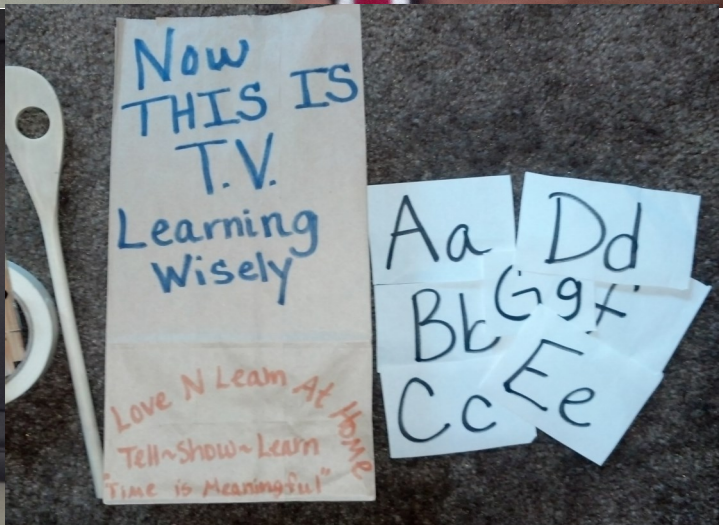
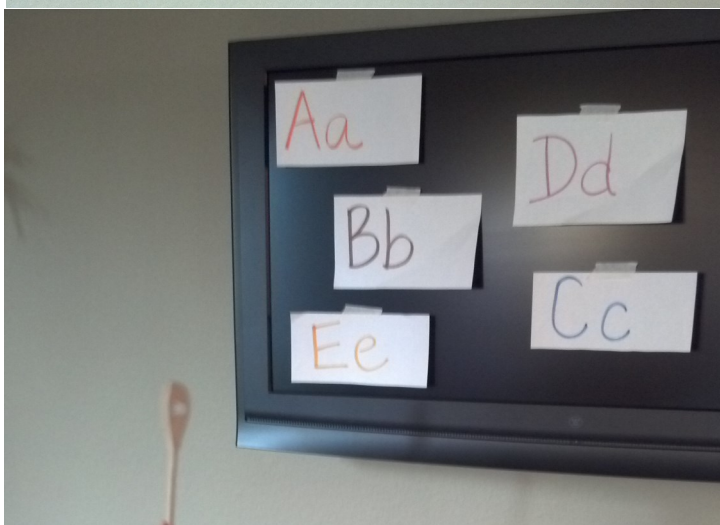
Television

Long wooden spoon (or plastic spoon)

Tape

Procedures:

1. To prepare activity: Write whichever alphabet letters you would like on white sheets of half paper. You can write all upper case letters or all lower case letters.
2. On small square pieces of white paper, write those same letters.
3. View picture on next page for examples!
4. Put the small letters in a brown bag for your child to hold.
5. Tape the larger letters on the TV directly.





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6. Hold up your child; or have them stand on the floor, a stool or chair, depending on how high your TV is off the ground.
7. Encourage your child to pull a small letter out of the bag, then use the spoon to find and match it to the letter on the TV.
8. Encourage this same way of doing with your child until all letters have been matched.

Milestones to meet:

The child is introduced to letters. The child begins to recognize and name letters. The child shows a willingness to find and match letters.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
