

Objective: The child recognizes letters and matches them on the TV.

Materials needed:

White paper (cut whole sheets in half; you will also need small squared pieces of paper)

Marker


Television

Long wooden spoon (or plastic spoon)


Tape

Procedures:

- 1. To prepare activity: Write which ever alphabet letters you would like on white sheets of half paper. You can write all upper case letters or all lower case letters.
- 2. On small square pieces of white paper, write those same letters.
- 3. View picture on next page for examples!
- 4. Put the small letters in a brown bag for your child to hold.
- 5. Tape the larger letters on the TV directly.



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- 6. Hold up your child; or have them stand on the floor, a stool or chair, depending on how high your TV is off the ground.
- 7. Encourage your child to pull a small letter out of the bag, then use the spoon to find and match it to the letter on the TV.
- 8. Encourage this same way of doing with your child until all letters have been matched.

Milestones to meet:

The child recognizes letters. The child begins to name letters. The child can find and match letters together.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
