

Objective: The child is introduced to letters through real-life object exploration.

## Materials needed:

ABC Objects in your home (ideas include: A-apple, B-ball, C-cotton balls) Blank white paper and marker (you will use only)

## Procedures:

- 1. Using your home objects, go through each one with your child. Say the name of the object and the letter it begins with. (i.e. A is for apple)
- 2. Write the letter A on a white sheet of paper. Again, say "A" to your child. Hold up to show. Let them explore with the apple independently. See what they do, it's how they learn!
- 3. Do the same thing as stated in #2 with the letter B and C. Let them explore with the ball and cotton balls independently, too.



Extension Activity: Walk with your child around the mall or an outside area with a lot of street or informational signs; such as a park. Look for print and letters. Point to and show your child while holding your child, saying the letters you may see to teach them.

## Milestones to meet:

The child is introduced to letters. The child builds fine-motor skills and senses to explore objects. The child uses their visual development of looking at a letter written to increase their language-capacity and early print-awareness.

## **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
