



Letters in my name

Ages 2 years to 3 years

Objective: The child is introduced to the letters in their name after matching them together and

practicing tracing them.

Materials needed:

Scotch tape

Black Sharpie marker (you will use only)

White sheet of paper

High lighter

Crayon or Marker for child to use

Writing paper (printable)

Procedures:

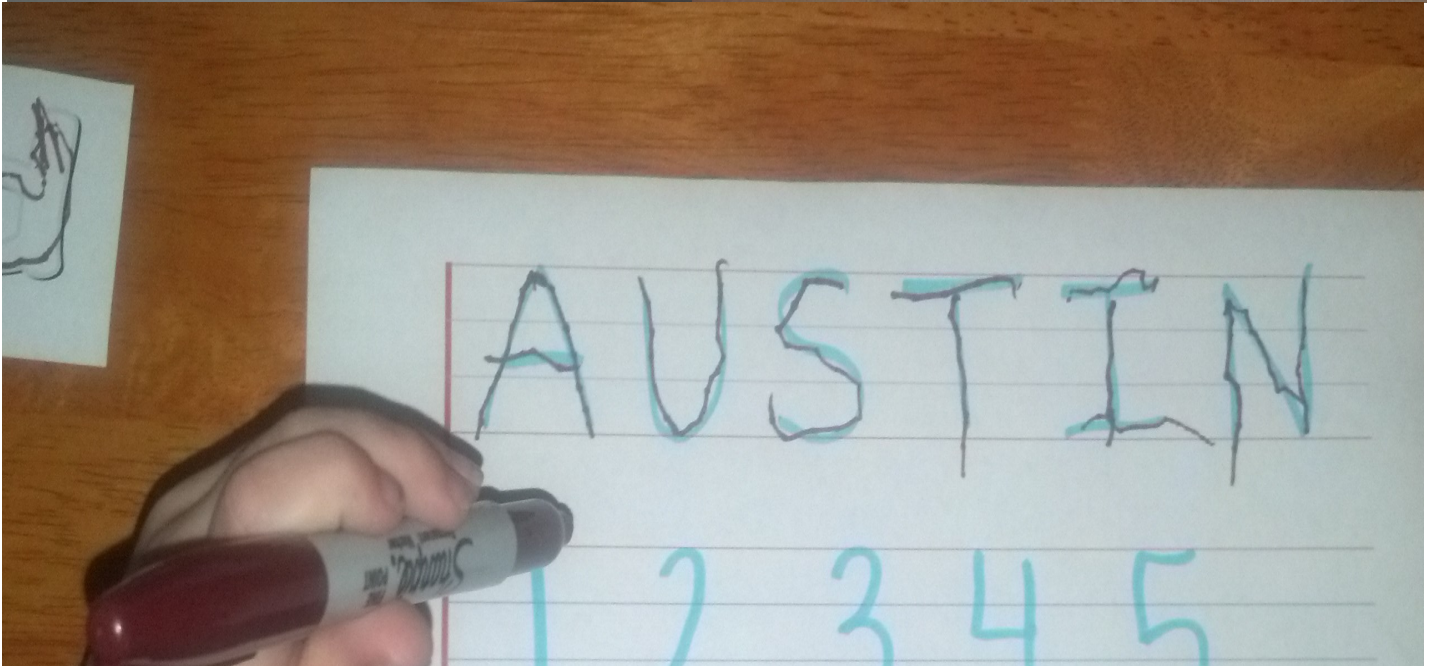
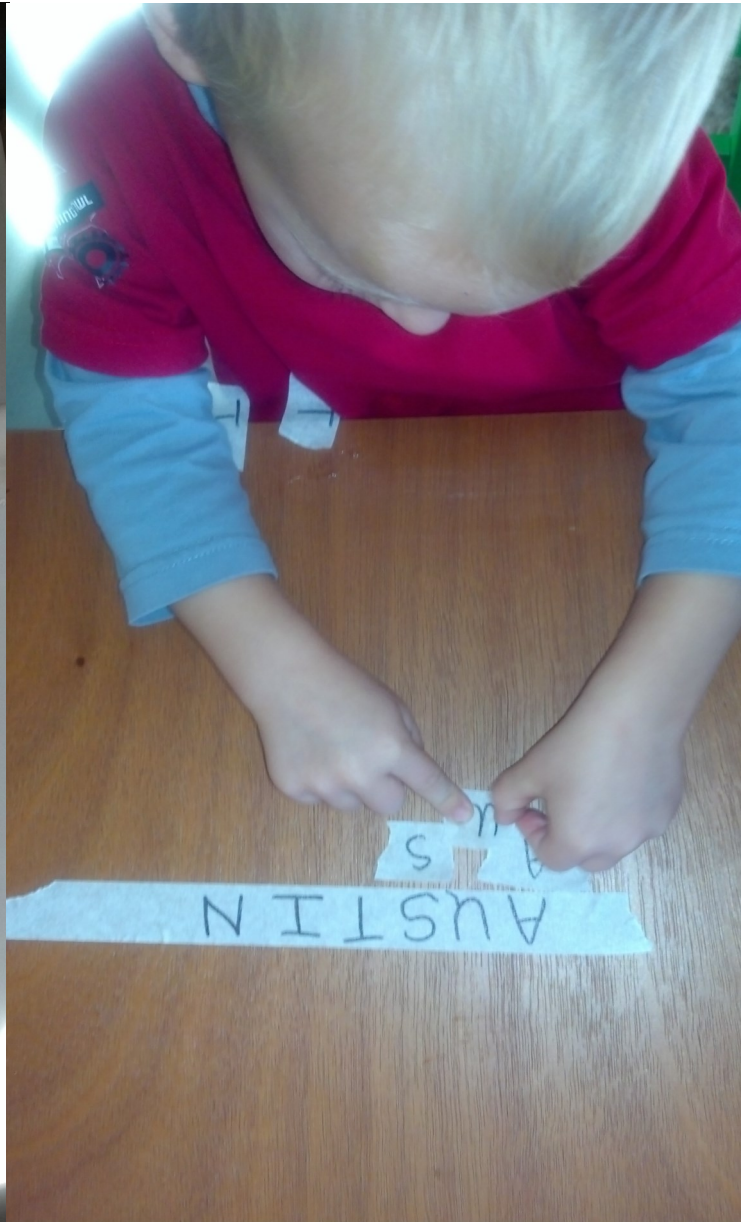
1. On a small squared piece of scotch tape, using a black sharpie marker, write the letter A. Do the same for letter B, C, D, & E. OR do the letters in your child's name only.

2. View picture examples on next page.

3. Hand your child each letter-tape one at a time.

Show them how to stick it on the table or carpeted area.

4. Have child put letters in order from left to right,





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spelling out their name; say each letter to child as they do so, and ask them to repeat you.

5. **Make it easier to begin-** Write out their name on a white sheet of paper, and have them put the letters written on tape pieces to the matching letters in their name on the paper.

6. Using the printable writing paper and high lighter, parent will write out the letters in your child's name. Say them out loud, teaching child. Then, either helping by holding hand/grasp, or showing child what to do first, have them trace the letters in their name.

Milestones to meet:

The child is introduced to letters. The child can create using fine-motor skills to put tape on paper. The child learns to recognize the letters in their name. The child can match same letters together.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
