



Talk, Count, Trace

2 years—3 years

Objective: The child will learn how to count up to 5 and trace numbers.

Materials needed:

Talk, Count, Trace (printable)

Crayon or Marker

Procedures

1. Have your child sit at a small table.
2. Help your child understand the way each of the community helpers look on the printable sheet.
3. Next, model to show child what it is you want them to do. Count how many community helpers are on #1. Then, trace the number in the box that corresponds with how many there are.
4. Help child trace the numbers, count each group of community helpers, and complete the sheet.
5. After they have each been counted and the numbers have been traced, go back through the sheet with child and talk about each group of community helper you see.
6. Talk about what kind of community helper they are. What they do to help us in our community.



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Ways we can thank them for how they help us and how each of those community helpers are hero's to keep us safe.

5. Talking with your child about these community helpers we may see in our community will not only build knowledge in your child, but also awareness of others, work ethic, and comprehension of what it means to help others and keep them safe.

Milestones to meet:

The child shows understanding of community helpers they may see in their community. The child can count up to 5. The child shows willingness to try and trace numbers following a yellow outline. The child builds understanding of how certain people help us and keep up safe.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
