## WEEKLY LESSON 1

Dear God...

Writing a letter to God.

Have your child tell you something they would like to tell God. You write what they say down, have them help you put it in an envelope, stamp it, and put it in the mail box. One week later, write a letter back to your child "from God" and read it to them at bedtime.



## WEEKLY LESSON 2

Hearing me...

If you can hear me God...

Talk with your child about how God can hear them and he always listens even if he doesn't directly talk back to you; he is always in our head and heart. Ask your child to tell God 3 important things they want God to know. How they feel, what they want/need, things they love, or thanking God for things can all be thoughts you can teach your child to share with God.

## WEEKLY LESSON 3

God is great!

God is special because...

Have your child finish this sentence to you this week. Teach your child why God is special. He helps us, he listens, he protects us, he provides for us, he watches over us, he loves us, he is the most powerful person in the world. You can write down some reasons why God is special on small pieces of paper, put them in a box, have your child pull one reason out each night this week and read it together at bedtime.

## WEEKLY LESSON 4

Who God is...

God is a hero. He is powerful. He is great.

Talk and teach your child how your family values and defines who God is. Who is he? What does he do for us? How does he exist in us? (faith)

Have your child draw a picture of what they think God looks like. Help them write his name "God" /or trace it after you write it out for them. Then, help spark your child's imagination by asking them to finish the questions.

## WEEKLY LESSON 5

Good v.s. Sad

Knowing the difference in the two.

Draw a happy face on one sheet of paper and a sad face on another sheet of paper. Show your child the happy face and teach them God likes "happy, good choices." Show your child the sad face and tell them God is sad when you make "bad choices." Show your child the happy face again, asking child what kinds of choices do they make that are good choices (these make God happy)? Show your child the sad face, asking your child "what kinds of choices would make God sad?"
