



# Shapes of Winter

## Ages 2 years—3 years

**Objective:** The child builds early math skills by seeing and repeating shape names.

**Materials needed:**

Shapes of Winter (printable)

Scissors

Tape

**Procedures**

1. Have your child sit on the floor with you next to a low window, blank wall, or mirror.
2. Before hand, cut out all of the shape pictures from the printable sheet.
3. You are going to hold up each shape one at a time to show your child, say the name of the shape, and then tape it up to the wall or window. Ask child to "repeat" the shape words after you.
4. Teach what the picture is of and what kind of shape it is at the same time. Always ask your child to repeat words/shape names after you to build language capacity.
5. Teach to your child other things that could be those same shapes to build further knowledge



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and comprehension skills.

### **Milestones to meet:**

The child learn about shapes after seeing and hearing the names of them; the child can repeat or say the shapes name they hear.

### **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
