



Stickers On Your Name

Ages 2 years—3 years

Objective: The child demonstrates the ability to use fine-motor skills to pull stickers off and place them on the letters in their name.

Materials needed:

Stickers (Holiday stickers preferred)

White paper and Marker

Procedures

1. Sit on the floor or at the table with your child.
2. Begin by writing your child's first name on the white paper. Write in ALL CAPS for this age—capital letters they learn to recognize first.
3. Now model to show your child what you want them to do. Take a sticker and put it on a letter in your child's name. Say the letter you put the sticker on. Have child repeat it after you.
4. Encourage your child to get the stickers and put them on the letters in their name.
5. If they can not peel the stickers on their own yet, you do it for them and have them put it on the paper on the letters in their name.



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6. Continue activity until child no longer shows any more interest or every letter has a sticker on it and has been said/taught.

Milestones to meet:

The child uses fine-motor skills and shows the ability to peel stickers. The child shows a willingness to put stickers on the paper; encouraged to put them on the letters in their name. The child repeats the letters after hearing them.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
