Opposites Ages 3 years—4 years

Objective: The child begins to recognize opposites when show pictures. The child is able to distinguish which opposite pictures belong together.

Materials needed:

Opposite Sheet (printable)

Procedures:

- Begin by explaining to your child what the word "opposites" mean. Opposites: Things that are related differently. "It can be...or can be (or) It is not...It is"
- 2. Show your child the opposite picture sheet. Keep the matching opposites together using phrases such as stated above when showing opposites. (i.e. It is not <u>cold</u>...It is <u>hot</u> (or) It can be <u>morning</u>...It can be <u>night</u>) Use the pictures on the sheet to teach as clues.
- 3. Continue until each question on the sheet has been answered with your child.

- 4. Assistance is okay! Just keep using specific phrases as mentioned which helps with language association and building the capacity knowledge of what "opposite" means.
- 5. Brainstorm with your child other things that are opposites. Such as clapping and stomping, or good and bad. Talk about these together.

Milestones to meet:

The child is able to match opposite pictures together. They begin to understand the concept of opposite.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
