

Objective: The child will create with paint using multiple objects to explore.

Materials needed:

Different color paints (you can also use the "cornstarch finger paint" recipe in the Messy Madness Education Resources on the website)
Different types of items to use as "paint brushes": toothbrushes, straws, plastic spoons, plastic forks, their fingers, turkey baster, sponges, Q-tips, and real paint brushes
White paper

Procedures:

- 1. Get in a space that you can cover with newspaper or white paper to avoid a mess.
- 2. Have your child wear an apron or old tee-shirt.
- 3. Allow for them to get messy and be creative on their own!
- 4. Put a small amount of one or two colors of paint on a paper plate.



Rotate colors out frequently, but limiting to one or two colors at a time for your child.

- 5. Give them the objects on the list above of "paint brushes" to use.
- 6. Let them be creative and use the objects to paint on the white paper.
- 7. At the end, put two different colors on one plate and let them mix it with their hands and smear it on the white paper. This will be their favorite part! Mix two colors together to make a new color—such as blue and yellow to make green!

Milestones to meet:

The child shows a creative willingness. The child can grab objects to use as paint brushes.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
