# Writing My Name Ages 3 years—4 years

Objective: The child uses fine-motor skills to demonstrate writing their name.

## Materials needed:

White paper

Glue

Rice

Marker

### Procedures:

- 1. Have your child sit at a table.
- 2. Place the white paper in front of them. On it, write your child's first name in marker.
- 3. Say each letter of your child's name pointing to each, have them repeat them with you.
- 4. Trace over the writing in glue.
- 5. Explain to your child they are going to "write their name," but use rice to do so.
- 6. Place rice in a bowl they can easily grab into.



- 7. Have them take pinches of the rice, and place on glue in each letter of their name, like "tracing" the letters. Have them spell their name out loud for you; saying each letter.
- 8. Shake off remaining rice in sink or trashcan.
- 9. Let dry for a few hours.
- 10. They will have a picture of their name in writing made out of rice. Much more fun than just using a pencil, huh?!

# Milestones to meet:

The child recognizes the letters in their name. They can use fine-motor skills to "trace" the letters in their name as a form of writing.

# **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
