



Animal Sounds

Ages 3 to 4 years

Objective: The child is able to look at pictures of an animal and demonstrate verbally the sound that each of them make.

Materials needed:

Animal Pictures (print from resources page)

Procedures:

1. Begin by looking at all of the pictures on each card.
2. Have your child tell you what each animal is. Go through all cards.
3. Now, revisit the cards, having your child make the sound each animal makes when seeing the picture of it.
4. Making the animal sound with them is always fun to do!
5. To extend the activity in a Social Studies lesson, you can look at each picture of the animals and have your child discuss their physical



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characteristics, places where they might see that animal, what kind of place they like to live in, and what the weather is like there.

6. You can turn this into a Math lesson by having your child sort the animals according to similar or different physical attributes. You can also have them count the animals all together, count each of their legs, or have them group by small and large animals.

Milestones to meet:

The child can associate an animal to the sound it makes. The child can describe animals, their characteristics, and living habitats. The child can count, sort, and group.
