## Ages 1 year to 2 years

**Objective:** The child begins to recognize familiar shapes after sorting and gluing shape

pieces to its associated shape.

### Materials needed:

Shapes Stencils (print from resources page) Extra paper (white or colored) for stencil

copying/tracing and cutting

Scissors

Large white pieces (or colorful) paper (10) Glue stick

#### Procedures:

- Before lesson, you will need to cut up multiple shapes from the shape stencil tracer page printed from the resources page. You will probably need 10 of each shape.
- Also, on the big pieces of paper, draw each shape on a piece of paper so that you have a large shape with each of your stencil shapes cut up.

3.Have your child glue on the small stencil shapes to the associated large shape on the big paper. Your goal is to make a "shape collage" for each shape. Use color paper when cutting the shape stencils and you will have many pretty shape collages!!!
4. Make sure you tell your child what each shapes name is while doing this activity.
5. For gluing, either use a glue stick that is easy for little children or put a small amount of glue in a small paper cup and a popsicle stick and have them smear on little amounts of glue to the paper. Help from you is also

recommended for the child.

### Milestones to meet:

The child is beginning to recognize simple shapes and associate their names with them.
