

Objective: The child begins to recognize the letters and sounds in their name.

## Materials needed:

Marker
White pieces of paper (1 for every letter in their name)
Stickers (large for peeling)

## Procedures:

- 1. On each piece of white paper, write one letter in their name, so that when lined up, it spells your child's name.
- 2. Give your child the stickers. Have them peel and place stickers on the letters in their name. If they are not able to peel the stickers on their own, you peel them and hand them to your child and they can put them on the on letters.



- 3. Try to get them to put the stickers on the letter outlines by showing them how to do it. Also, say each letter and the letters sound to your child as you place stickers on.
- 4. This will help with early letter-writing (tracing) skills and how letters are formed through hands-on association.
- 5. Continue until all the stickers are gone and each letter has stickers on it, or until your child is not showing interest anymore.

## Milestones to meet:

The child is beginning letter-word association and recognizing the letters in their name.
