



“I Am” eStorybook

Ages 3 years—4 years

Objective: The child uses visual and language development through storytelling.

Materials needed:

“I Am” eStorybook (printable)

Procedures

1. Sit with your child. You can choose to print out the eStorybook or read straight from the computer screen with your child.
2. Begin by reading the eStorybook to your child. Read slowly, word for word, to really have your child be able to hear the words and sounds you are saying.
3. Point to the pictures, ask child to tell you what they see on each page.
4. Ask child questions when reading: “What do you see? What is that? What does it do?”
5. While reading each sentence on every page, point to each word. Read the sentence first, then have child re-read it after you.



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6. Complete reading the eStorybook with your child; re-read and visit throughout this month for consistent teaching and learning.

Extension Activity: Have child tell you other things that describe what they do or who they are. Ask them questions about themselves (how old are you?) or tell them specific things, such as saying to child, “you are pretty or handsome” and “you are funny.”

Milestones to meet:

The child can follow along during a story being read to them. The child builds early language development and using words to tell you pictures they recognize in a story. The child can say the names of pictures they recognize in a story.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
