



# **“I Am” eStorybook**

## **Ages 2 years—3 years**

**Objective:** The child uses visual cues to build language development through storytelling.

**Materials needed:**

“I am” eStorybook (printable)

**Procedures**

1. Sit with your child in your lap. You can choose to print out the eStorybook or read straight from the computer screen.
2. Begin by reading the eStorybook to your child. Read slowly, word for word, to really have your child be able to hear the sounds you are making.
3. Point to the pictures, say the names of them you see, and describe them to your child. Ask child if they can repeat or say the word(s) of the pictures they see on each page with you.
4. Complete reading the eStorybook to your child; re-read and visit throughout this month for consistent teaching and learning.



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### **Key points to remember when reading:**

- Focus on pictures
- Ask open-ended questions (those that will spark thought in child, not just a “yes/no” answer)
- Read slowly and specifically word-for-word
- Point to words while reading
- Ask child to repeat/say words after you

### **Milestones to meet:**

The child can listen and look at a story being read to them. The child builds early language development and picture-word association skills. The child tries to repeat and say words after hearing them in a story. The child tries to say what they see in pictures.

### **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
