



Learning Colors

Ages 1 year—2 years

Objective: The child begins to recognize colors through visual cues and finding same color matches.

Materials needed:

Learning Colors (printable)

Procedures:

1. Cut out each of the color ovals out individually. Stack together.
2. One at a time, show your child the color and say the name of the color. Ask child to try and repeat you; I.e. "Can you say red?"
3. Go through all color cards until all are said and shown.
4. Now walk around the house, hold up one color at a time, say the colors name to your child, and find something of that same color in the house. Teach your child that they are the same color. Repeat the colors name and ask child to say it with you. I.e. "Can you say blue?"



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4. Teach for each color this same way with your child; finding matching objects around the house of the same color shown on the color ovals.

Milestones to meet:

The child is introduced to colors. The child begins recognizing a connection through objects which show same colors.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
