



Learning Colors

Ages 3 years—4 years

Objective: The child can name and match colors.

Materials needed:

Learning Colors (printable)

Crayons or Markers

Yellow Highlighter

Procedures:

1. One at a time, show your child the color ovals and ask your child to name the color they see.
2. Go through all color ovals until all are said and taught.
3. Now have your child sit at a table and point to each letter in each color word, spelling out the color word together. Repeat the colors name again. Have child repeat after you.
4. Now let them color in the blank boxes the same color as it is. Such as, using a green crayon to color in the box labeled green. Ask child: "Can you color the box with the green crayon?"

Ages 3 years—4 years

4. Using a yellow highlighter, parent will write out each of the color words on the writing paper provided in the printable, then have your child trace the color words one at a time.

5. **Extension Activity:** Go on a color hunt with your child around the house, finding matching objects that are the same color shown on the color ovals.

Milestones to meet:

The child can recognize and name their colors.

The child can match same colors together. The child can trace letters and words.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
