

**Objective:** The child can use fine-motor skills and coordination to put pieces together to build a house picture.

## Materials needed:

House (printable)

Glue and Crayons

White sheet of paper

## **Procedures**

- 1. Have your child sit at a small table.
- 2. Cut the house pieces out first.
- 3. Put the picture of the house in front of your child on the table. Ask your child, while pointing to the picture, what is this a picture of?. Ask child to point to each of the parts of the house and tell you what they are; such as, the door, windows, & chimney. Teach each of their shapes.
- 4. Place the blank white sheet of paper, glue, and house pieces cut out in front of child.
- 5. Encourage them to glue on the pieces and build the house however they would like. Do not tell how to put it together; let child express on own.



- 6. Encourage your child to draw details to add to their home, such as people, animals, trees, clouds, sun, birds, and cars.
- 7. Let it dry completely after they have glued all of the house together on the sheet of white paper, then write their name and date on it.
- 8. Talk with your child about who lives in their house, where do they live, and other details such as if any pets live there? What are their names?

## Milestones to meet:

The child can use fine-motor skills and hand-eye coordination by creating a house picture. The child shows understanding in placement after putting together pieces to build a house picture. The child adds details to a picture.

## **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
