

**Objective:** The child can use words and thoughts to finish sentences being read to them.

# Materials needed:

Finish These Sentences (printable)
Pencil (something to write with)

## **Procedures**

- 1. For this lesson, you are going to have your child sit with you at a table or on the floor.
- 2. Begin by explaining to child that you will be telling them something and they have to complete the sentence with their own thoughts.
- 3. You will read them the sentence and have child answer.
- 4. Complete printable sheet questions. Write in the blanks your child's answers; or if your child already knows how to write on their own, have them fill in the blanks, writing in their answers.
- 5. After it has all been read and answered by child, go back and re-read it back to your child.



## **Extension Activities:**

\* For more fun, make up your own sentence phrases that your child can finish and solve. Such as things they know: I.e. "We drink out of a \_\_\_\_?" and "We take a bath in the \_\_\_\_\_?"

\* You can also have your child read you the sentences, and you fill in the answers with your own thoughts.

#### Milestones to meet:

The child can hear sentences and answer according to their own thoughts. The child demonstrates understanding of thought. The child builds early literacy and language capacity through sentence finisher phrases.

#### **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
