

**Objective:** The child begins to recognize familiar types of clothing worn in their environment.

## Materials needed:

Small box

Articles of clothing from your child: (all or any)

- Shirt/Jacket
- Shoes/Socks/Hose
- Diaper
- · Shorts/Pants/Skirts
- . Belt
- · Hat/Bows
- Bathing suit/Pajamas

## Procedures:

- 1. Sit with your child on the floor. Place all of the articles of clothing in a box.
- 2. Pull them out one at a time and show them one at a time to your child.
- 3. While showing, tell them what each clothing item is and where it belongs on your body.
- 4. Tell your child what kind of weather we wear it in. Such as, showing a jacket, you would say "Cold."



5. Once you pull one article of clothing out of the box at a time, say its name, encourage your child to repeat the word after you. I.e. "Can you say shirt?" 6. Optional: If available and applicable, put on and show your child very distinct articles of clothing that represent your culture. Such as: Shawls, Head dress pieces, scarfs, India female sari's, Western wear (cowboy hats or boots), jewelry, Military uniforms (for those who serve this is a form of a culture or way of life).

## Milestones to meet:

The child begins to recognize and learn the names of familiar clothing in which they wear. The child shows a willingness to try and repeat the names of clothing.

## **Evaluation:**
