



Picture-Name Cards

Ages 1 year—2 years

Objective: The child can recognize people they are familiar with and begins making the connection of letters and words associated to those faces.

Materials needed:

Picture-Name Cards (printable)

Real pictures of each person on name cards

Glue or Tape

Procedures:

1. Before hand, you will have to find pictures of the people listed on the name cards. You can either glue or tape them to the blank boxes on the cards.
2. Once dried or taped, cut each of the name cards out individually. Stack together.
3. Sit with your child on the floor or couch, or sit them in their highchairs to teach and avoid distractions.
4. Begin going through each of the name cards, showing your child the picture of the person



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and the word associated with it. Point to the picture first, say that person's name (or nick-name), then point to the associated word on the card and say it to your child. Ask child to try and repeat the word after you; I.e. "Can you say mommy?"

5. Continue this same way of teaching for each picture-name card, until all have been taught and gone through with your child.

Milestones to meet:

The child can recognize familiar faces. The child builds literacy and language. The child makes a connection between someone they recognize and words in print. The child tries to repeat words.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
