



# Picture-Name Cards

## Ages 2 years—3 years

**Objective:** The child can recognize people they are familiar with and can say the letters and words associated to those faces.

### Materials needed:

Picture-Name Cards (printable)

Real pictures of each person on name cards

Glue or Tape

### Procedures:

1. Before hand, you will have to find pictures of the people listed on the name cards. You can either glue or tape them to the blank boxes on the cards. Have child help match as necessary.
2. Once dried or taped, cut each of the name cards out individually. Stack together.
3. Sit with your child on the floor or table.
4. Begin going through each of the name cards, pointing to the picture first, ask child to say that person's name (or nick-name), then point to the associated word on the card and ask what it says to your child. I.e. "Can you say mommy?"



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5. Continue this same way of teaching for each picture-name card, until all have been taught and gone through with your child.

6. Afterwards, go back through the stack of picture-name cards, and pointing to each letter in the word, have your child repeat the letters after you say them and spell out each word. Do for each picture-word card.

### **Milestones to meet:**

The child can recognize familiar faces. The child builds literacy and language. The child makes a connection between someone they recognize and words in print. The child can read the words on cards that have matching pictures.

### **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
