



# Picture-Name Cards

## Ages 4 years—5 years

**Objective:** The child can recognize people they are familiar with, and can say the letters and trace the words associated to those faces.

### Materials needed:

Picture-Name Cards (printable)

Real pictures of each person on name cards

Glue or Tape

Marker or Crayon

### Procedures:

1. Before hand, you will have to find pictures of the people listed on the name cards. You can either glue or tape them to the blank boxes on the cards. Have child help you glue pictures on.
2. Once dried or taped, cut each of the name cards out individually. Stack together.
3. Sit with your child on the floor or table.
4. Begin going through each of the picture-name cards, ask child to say the person's name (or nick-name) they see, then point to the associated word on the card and read what it says.



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5. Continue this same way of teaching for each picture-name card, until all have been taught and gone through with your child.

6. Afterwards, go back through the stack of picture-name cards and have your child trace on the yellow words, while having your child say each letter as they trace it, spelling out the word. Have child do this same thing for each picture-word card.

### **Milestones to meet:**

The child can recognize familiar faces. The child builds literacy and language. The child makes a connection between someone they recognize and words in print. The child can read the words on cards that have matching pictures. The child can trace letters and words.

### **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
