

Objective: The child builds their fine motor skills through drawing a picture. The child shows social skills through mailing a letter to someone they know.

## Materials needed:

White sheet of paper Crayons or Markers Mailing stamp (1 postage) Envelope

## Procedures:

- 1. Have your child sit at a small table.
- 2. Put the sheet of paper in front of them.
- 3. Tell them they get to draw a picture for someone they love. Go through some people and ask who they want to mail a picture to. (grandma, grandpa, aunt, uncle, friend, ect.)
- 4. Give them the colors and tell them to draw a picture for whomever you both have decided to mail it to.
- 5. Write their name and date on the picture; let child write their own name too.



- 6. Ask child: "What do you want to tell \_\_\_\_?"
  Write down their answer on the paper. (as if the child was "writing a letter" and telling the person what they wanted to say, but you write what your child says. At this age, most children are not able to actually write yet; other than their own name.
- 7. Fold up the picture, put it in an envelope, write the address of whomever you both have chosen to mail it to, post it with a stamp, and mail it off.
- 8. Shhh!!! Don't tell them it's coming. They will be so happy to receive this picture letter from them!

## Milestones to meet:

The child builds fine motor skills through drawing a picture. The child builds social awareness through mailing a letter to someone they care about and telling them why they love them.

## **Evaluation:**
