

Objective: The child builds their fine motor skills through drawing a picture. The child shows social skills through mailing a letter to someone they know.

Materials needed:

Color and Mail It Letter (printable)

1 white sheet of paper

Crayons or Markers

Mailing stamp (1 postage)

Envelope

Procedures:

- 1. Have your child sit at a small table.
- 2. Put the printed out mail letter in front of them and the white sheet of blank paper.
- 3. Tell them they get to draw a picture and write a letter for someone they love. Go through some people and ask who they want to mail it to. (grandma, grandpa, aunt, uncle, friend, ect.)
- 4. Give them the colors. Tell them to draw a picture for whomever you both have decided to mail it to on the blank white sheet of paper.



- 6. Now have your child write a letter on the "mail letter" sheet.
- 7. If your child can not write yet, then ask your child, "What do you want to tell ____?" Write down their answer on the paper. (as if the child was "writing a letter" and telling the person what they wanted to say, but you write what your child says.
- 7. Have your child sign their own name on it.
- 8. Fold up the picture and letter, put it in an envelope, write the address of whomever you have chosen to mail it to, add a stamp, and mail it out.

Milestones to meet:

The child builds fine motor skills through drawing a picture. The child builds social awareness through mailing a letter to someone they care about. The child can tell what they think and/or write a letter.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
