

Objective: The child builds early reading skills, and can recognize and say the letters in their name. **Materials needed:**

White sheet of paper Sticky notes Black sharpie marker (you will use only)

Procedures:

- 1. Using the marker, write each letter out in your child's name on the white paper, saying the letter as you write. Have your child say each letter in their name, spelling it out to make the word.
- 2. Now write the letters in their name each on individual sticky notes. Again, do this in front of your child and say each letter out loud as you write it. Ask child to say each letter after you write it out.
- 3. Then, ask child to say their name for you. (I.e. "Can you tell me what your name is?"
- 4. Ask them to spell out their name while pointing to each letter on the white paper as they say it.



4. Now taking the letters on the sticky notes, start with their names first letter, hold it up, ask your child to tell you what letter it is, then place the letter on the sheet of paper where it matches.
5. Do this same thing for each letter in their name.
6. After all letters have been shown, said, and matched together; have your child point to each letter again, say it, and then tell you their whole name again.

Milestones to meet:

The child recognizes the letters in their name. The child can say the name of each letter in their name. The child knows their name.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
