

Objective: The child will match same pictures of ocean animals, and begin building language to say

their names.

Materials needed:

Go Fish! Cards (printable)

Procedures:

- 1. After printing out cards, cut each out individually.
- 2. Go over each ocean animal with your child, holding one up at a time in front of them and saying its name. Ask your child to 'say' it after you. (I.e. "Can you say fish?" Or "Can you say dolphin?")
- 3. Now lay all of the cards down on the floor FACE DOWN, so you and your child can not see the pictures of the animals.
- 4. To teach "how to match and look for similar looking pictures," flip over a card. Look at it and say its name. Then flip over another card. Say its name. Ask to child: Are they both the same?

- 5. Answer either "yes" or "no".
- 6. If they are the same: Say to your child, "Look those are the same. A (i.e. Fish) and a (i.e. Fish).
 Fish).
 They are both (i.e. Fish).

- 6. If they are not the same: Say to your child, "No, they are not both the same animals. We have to try again! Now it is your turn to flip over 2 cards and see if you can find 2 of the same animals."
- 7. Let child have a turn to flip over 2 cards and see if they can find a match. Help as needed.
- 8. Continue until all "matches" have found.

Tip: When someone finds a matched pair of animals, they keep that match and put it aside.

Milestones to meet:

The child begins to develop understanding of matching similarities. The child can say new words.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
