

Objective: The child is able to listen to and follow along when hearing a story about summertime.

Materials needed:

Summertime Storybook (eBook printable)

Procedures:

- 1. Sit in a quiet area around your house to read or you can read straight from computer screen.
- 2. Start from the beginning, reading the title page to your child.
- 3. Begin reading the book. Point to each picture, say its name and ask your child to try and 'repeat or say' the word after you.
- 4. Then read the sentence(s) on the bottom of each page, which uses each word to express meaning. Point to each word while reading.
- 5. Re-read this story book to your child more than once this month for them to really begin understanding and grasping the meaning of certain summertime words and pictures.

 Consistency is what will build their capacity



for language development.

6. TRY THIS! Do not read it to them; flip through each page, point to the picture and ask them what it is. Let them try and read it to you!

Milestones to meet:

The child can listen to a story. The child shows willingness to try and repeat a word after hearing it in a story. The child can look at pictures and begins to build language through association; they can say the name of something they recognize?

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
