

Objective: The child builds language through song and rhyme.

Materials needed:

5 Ice-cream Popsicle Puppet Pictures (optional: printable)

Popsicle sticks

Procedures:

- 1. Before lesson, cut each ice cream picture out individually, and glue each to the ends of popsicle sticks (making "popsicle puppets")
- 2. Then, sing this song and rhyme with your child, using the popsicle puppets as visual props. Let child hold the 'puppets' too!

It is sung to the tune of 5 little monkeys jumping on a bed

5 little ice creams melting away I ate one on a hot summer day It was so yummy, now it's in my tummy Mom (Dad) says now I can go out and play!

Repeat song and rhyme, descending count from 4-1 until all ice-cream popsicles have been sung and "eaten away"
