

Objective: The child can say words that are associated with summer and acquires new language when looking at pictures.

Materials needed:

Summer Word Cards (printable)

Procedures:

- 1. Cut out all of the "summer word" cards individually.
- 2. One at a time, hold up to show your child the word and say the name of it to them. Point to the picture of the word and ask your child to say what it is they see. (I.e. While pointing to a picture of the ocean, you ask: "What is this? Can you say ocean?")
- 3. Now, spell out each word with your child, saying the letters together.
- 4. Go through all cards, teaching this same way.
- 5. Optional: Use some of the picture word cards and sing the song on the next page with your child.



A Summer Word Song:

Sung to the tune of Twinkle, Twinkle

Hold up picture cards when saying the underlined words to help teach your child word-meaning through visual representation

Ice cream, Ice cream you're so yummy!
In the summer, it is sunny.
We go swimming at the pool,
During summer there's no school!
Picnics, Picnics are so fun!
Summer is for everyone!

Milestones to meet:

The child can listen to words and watches pictures when shown; they can say words the see by looking at a picture of it. They build their language capacity of unknown words and pictures.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
