Days of the Week

Ages 3 years—4 years

Objective: The child develops a language in another form, by saying the days of the week in both English and Spanish.

Materials needed:

Spanish days of the week cards (printable)

[Online Spanish Calendar Audio](#)

Procedures:

1. Cut out Spanish days of the week cards individually. Stack together.
2. Go through each of them, like flash cards, with your child, saying the name of the day of the week on the card in both English and Spanish.
3. Going through the words, show them the online calendar (link above) to make the association of what they stand for. Point to the days of the week on it and say them with child in both English and Spanish. Ask child to repeat after you saying the days of the week.

4. Now sing this fun days of the week song to your child! First time in English (as written), then use the Spanish days of the week words in its place. Point to days of the week on the calendar while singing. It is sung to the tune of "The Adam's Family"
