



Spanish Numbers

Ages 3 years—4 years

Objective: The child begins to develop a language in another form, by recognizing and saying numbers and hearing their name in both English and Spanish.

Materials needed:

Spanish Number Cards (printable)

Procedures:

1. Cut out Spanish Number Cards individually. Stack together.
2. Go through each of them, like flash cards, with your child, saying the name of the number on the card and counting the stars on the cards (point while counting) in both English and Spanish. Ask child to repeat saying the numbers with you.
3. Now go through them again, but backwards. Start with number 10 and go to 0. Say the number word in both languages, and count the stars while pointing to them on each number card. Ask child to count saying the numbers with you.



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4. Now sing this fun number song to your child! It is sung to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star"

uno, dos, number time
tres, cuatro, number rhyme!
cinco, seis, OH YEA!
siete, ocho, MY I SHINE!!
Nueve, diez, number time
That is my number rhyme!

5. Help your child match the numeral to the correct amount of stars shown on the cards.

Milestones to meet:

The child can listen to and say numbers spoken in both languages, English and Spanish. The child can count from 1-10. The child can match numbers to the amount it shows.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
