



Spanish Shapes

Ages 1 year—2 years

Objective: The child begins to hear a language in another form, learning shapes and hearing their name in both English and Spanish.

Materials needed:

Spanish Shape Cards (printable)

Procedures:

1. Cut out Spanish Shape Cards individually. Stack together.
2. Go through each of them, like flash cards, with your child, saying the name of the shape on the card in both English and Spanish.
3. Look for shapes around your house. Say the name of the shapes you find in both English and Spanish. Refer to the picture cards as necessary to help child understand the connection.



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4. If possible depending on whether or not you have the objects in or around your house, tape each pic-word card to the object. This will allow for your child to make connections with objects and build their language capacity and print-awareness.
5. It is always good to label things around your house or child's bedroom to drowned your child in a print-rich environment! This gets them more interested in letters and reading for the future!

Milestones to meet:

The child does shows willingness to listen to words of shapes in both English and Spanish. This child begins to learn about shapes and builds recognition.

Evaluation:
