



Big and Little Turkeys

Ages 2 to 3 years

Objective: The child will recognize big and little concepts when sorting different sized pictures of turkeys.

Materials needed:

Big and Little Turkeys (printable)

Scissors

Procedures

1. Sit with your child at a small table or on the floor for this activity.
2. Cut out the big and little turkeys before hand.
3. Hold up one at a time, saying whether it is big or little to your child. Ask child, "Is it big or small?"
4. Use emphasis in your voice when teaching the concept BIG and whisper with little emphasis in your voice when teaching the concept little.
5. Put all of the little turkeys on the table or floor in front of your child and count them. Ask your child to count them along with you. "Can you count the turkeys with me?"



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6. Spread all of the turkey's face up, down on the table or floor. Help your child sort them into two categories, big and small.

Milestones to meet:

The child shows understanding of the concept big and small after seeing pictorial representations and sorting them into categories.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
