

Objective: The child will build understanding of body placement after creating a turkey picture.

Materials needed:

Turkey and Feathers (printable)
Crayons or Markers

Glue, Scissors, Crayons

Procedures

- 1. Have your child sit at a small table.
- 2. Before hand, parent cuts the turkey pieces out.
- 3. Have your child color the pieces.
- 4. Help your child glue the pieces to a white sheet of paper, building the turkey. Teach child where the gobbler, feet, and feathers go.
- 5. Let dry completely.
- 6. Ask your child, "what do you love?"
- 7. Write their responses on each of the feathers.
- 8. If your child is not able to tell you, then you write down things you love and are thankful for about your child on the feathers.

Help with gluing as necessary. You glue, they do!



Optional: For more fun, let your child glue on some real feathers to the turkey.

Milestones to meet:

The child builds creativity skills through creating a turkey craft. The child demonstrates awareness of body placement when creating a turkey.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
