

Objective: The child recognizes familiar faces and can use language to associate names with them.

Materials needed:

Family photos or Family album

Procedures:

- 1. Find some family photos around the house. If you have a family scrapbook made that would be ideal!
- 2. Go through the photos with your child and saying the name of each person you see.

 See if your child will repeat or say the name (or just the associated word i.e. "da da" or "da" instead of their real names)
- 3. If you have not already created a family scrapbook, use the photos you found or have laying around and glue them to pieces of



white paper. Write the persons actual name beside the photo and the word associated (mom, dad, grandma, aunt, sister, pet, ect.)

- 4. Let your child look at these and keep them to refer back to often with your child.
- 5. While looking through the photo album, you can describe where you were or what you were doing in the picture to your child. This will increase picture-detail awareness and early comprehension skills through picture telling.

Milestones to meet:

The child recognizes familiar faces and can say the names of the people they see and know.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
