



# THANKSGIVING Letter Pull

## Ages 1 to 2 years

**Objective:** The child uses fine-motor skills to see letters and pull them off a wall.

### Materials needed:

Sticky notes

Marker

### Procedures

1. Before hand, write out the word "THANKSGIVING" on sticky notes (where each letter in the word "thanksgiving" is written on its own sticky note sheet).
2. Find an empty, open wall around your house.
3. Put up all sticky notes with the letters written on them on the wall-low enough for your child to grab at when sitting or standing. Spread them out, but keep all in one place for easier focus for this age.
4. Encourage your child to go get, grab at, and pull off each of the letters.
5. As they do so, say that letter to your child.



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6. Encourage your child until all letters in the word "THANKSGIVING" have been pulled off of the wall.

7. As they pull off each letter, you say the letters name and ask your child to repeat you. I.e. "Can you say T?"

### **Milestones to meet:**

The child builds early literacy development through looking at letters and hearing the letters name.

The child can visually see something and use fine-motor skills to pull it off the wall? The child uses hand-eye coordination by pulling off stickers.

### **Evaluation:**

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
