

# Fun in the Fall

<b>Leaves</b>	Go on a leaf hunt around your neighborhood. When you get home, discover them together! Put them under a white sheet of paper, have child use crayons, & make leaf print rubbings
<b>Apples</b>	Cut them open, count their seeds, use them for “apple prints” painting on white paper!
<b>Birdseed</b>	Give your child a cup and scoop, put some birdseed in a bucket, & have child transfer!
<b>Scarecrows</b>	Using hay, old clothes, & sticks make a large one in your front yard! Use a pumpkin for the head! Let your child draw it a face!
<b>Clothing Sort</b>	Go through your child’s closet, have them help! Sort the summer and fall clothes in separate piles! Have them put together matches, such as pants and long sleeve shirt!
<b>Sweet Potatoes</b>	Open up a can, put a spoonful on a paper plate, & “finger paint” on white paper!
<b>Corn Shucks</b>	Build your child’s fine-motor skills by letting them help you shuck corn on the cobs!
<b>Acorns</b>	Go on a nature walk, look for & collect acorns. Using tongs & a muffin pan, have your child “pinch” them to build fine-motor skills and 1-to-1 correspondence!
<b>Trees</b>	Have your child make “finger prints” with paint on a tree you draw on white paper! Imitating leaves and apples using red & green paint!
