Pumpkins

Cut it open and discover the inside pulp with your child! How does it feel? Then, estimate and count the pumpkin seeds inside.

Halloween Plastic Rings

At your local dollar store, you can find plastic Halloween rings of different kinds. Have your child sort them by color and type, and then make patterns with them!

Spider Webs

Get a spider web, put it on a window. Help your child to add some plastic spiders on it & allow them to explore using sense of touch!

Skeleton Pieces

At most dollar stores (Dollar Tree does have these), they have plastic skeleton pieces. Have your child put them together like “people.”

Pumpkin Pie Filling

Open up a can of pumpkin pie filling and on a sheet of wax paper, let your child finger paint using it. Make letters and shapes in it too!

Make-up Crayons

Face painting, no way! More fun-Have your child use these as a writing tool on paper!

Dressing Up

Let your child dress up like mom and dad! Give them some of your clothes and have fun!

Pumpkin Painting

Using a real pumpkin and washable paint, have your child paint their pumpkin! Sit it out on your front porch for fall décor!

Hay Dig and Find

Get a large barrel of hay (find at Michael's craft store). Separate it outside in the yard, use real (small) pumpkins, hide them in the hay and encourage your child to find them!
